

REFUND POLICY

The following policy statement is applicable to all council and district activities where a fee is collected by the Capitol Area Council.

1. Refund requests will only be considered if made in writing.
2. A service charge of twenty-five percent (25%) of the activity fee will be assessed on all refunds to cover the costs incurred in preparation of the activity and processing the refund.
3. Written refund requests submitted after the activity will be considered only for personal illness or family emergencies. No refund requests will be accepted after ten (10) days following the end of the activity.
4. Consideration for a full refund will be considered for special hardship cases and for advanced level training courses such as Wood Badge and Powder Horn.
5. For major activities that require a non-refundable deposit, such as council contingents to the National Jamboree and Philmont, a full refund less the non-refundable deposit will be considered based on the time of the request and the Council's ability to fill the slot with another participant.
6. Refund checks will be issued to the individual or entity paying the original fee within 30 days of receipt of the request pending its approval.
7. Fees are only transferable within the same unit to a Scout or adult leader not currently registered for that specific activity.
8. If an activity is cancelled or postponed and the participant cannot participate during the alternate date, the full fee will be refunded.

You may want to bring a wagon or cart to carry your camp gear from the parking area to the campsite. To ensure the safety, security, and enjoyment of ALL participants, please read and abide by the following rules:

- **Must submit a Personal Class 1 Heath History form at check in for each Cub and adult partner. Form #34414**
- **PARK IN DESIGNATED AREA ONLY. No vehicles will be allowed in the campsites.**
- In accordance with BSA national standards, no one will be allowed to ride in the back of a truck at any time and helmets must be worn when bicycling.
- Due to limited space, no siblings will be allowed at the Cub/Partner Campout.
- No campfires (except program) will be permitted if fire ban is in effect.
- No Pets are allowed.
- Do not climb on any fences. Most fences are for safety purposes and mark the reservation boundary. All participants must follow any and all rules that are posted, printed, or announced by Cub / Partner staff.
- **Late arrivals, please report to Wooten Lodge for registration.**
- Be sure and bring your Handbook with you so you can work on other outdoor achievements and electives in your spare time. HAVE FUN!

Directions to Cub World

To reach Cub World from Austin, head east on Highway 290. In Elgin, turn south(right) on Highway 95 and go 12.8 miles to the intersection of FM 1441. Turn left onto FM 1441. Go 3.4 miles down FM 1441. The LCRA Lost Pines Scout Reservation entrance is on the right.

Or, head east on Highway 71 to Bastrop, turn north (left) on Highway 95 in Bastrop and go 3.8 miles to the intersection with FM 1441. Turn right onto 1441. Go 3.4 miles down FM 1441. The LCRA Lost Pines Scout Reservation entrance is on the right.

Just after you enter, take a left. Follow the road for 2.5 miles to the Cub World parking area.

Other Items of Interest

- Participants are encouraged to carpool to camp due to the limited number of parking spaces available at Cub World.
- Trading Post – A trading post stocked with Scouting stuff, drinks and snacks will be open during the Cub/Partner Campout. Participants will have an opportunity to purchase additional t-shirts, hats, Cub Scouting items, and crafts at our fully stocked trading post.
- Restroom and showers are available at Cub World in addition to portable toilets and latrines located throughout camp.
- **Weather Policy:** If local forecast 24 hours prior to the event is for rain of 1" per hour or more for Saturday day or evening, the event will be rescheduled.
