Cub World Policies

All policies strictly enforced on all facilities

CHECK IN – All Cub World users must stop @ the entrance to Lost Pines Scout Reservation and check in for final instructions from the volunteer CampMaster.

(Preferably in one group if at all possible)

ROSTER OF PARTICIPANTS & ADULTS ATTENDING – Unit Cub World Coordinator is responsible for turning in a final roster of youth and adults to the volunteer CampMaster @ check in. (Final roster is critically important in the event Camp must be evacuated due to weather, fire, or other unforeseen hazards)

Trained Leaders - At least one adult must have completed Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO, No. 34162A) to properly understand the importance of program intent, youth protection guidelines, health and safety, site selection, age appropriate activities, and sufficient adult participation.

Alcohol and Drugs – It is the policy of the Boy Scouts of America that the use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances are not permitted at encampment or activities on property owned and/or operated by the Boy Scouts of America, or at any activity involving participation of youth members.

Campfires – Will only be allowed when Burn Ban issued by Bastrop County is NOT in effect. You must provide your own wood for campfires and DO NOT cut down Cub World trees.

Chemical Fuels – The use of all chemical or liquid fuels is strictly forbidden. Propane cook stoves are recommended for cooking. Use battery-operated lanterns for lighting in tents.

POSITIVELY NO FLAMES ARE ALLOWED IN TENTS.

Pickups and Passengers – riding in the bed of a pickup is strictly forbidden. All passengers should be seated inside the cab of a vehicle and wearing seatbelts.

No Pets are allowed on camp property.

No scooters, skates, or skateboards on camp property.

Bikes are allowed with proper safety helmet.
