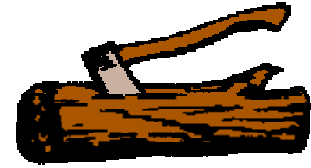


WOOD BADGE SR-904

Wood Badge is a comprehensive training course started by Robert S. Baden-Powell, founder of the Boy Scouts, to help leaders hone their skills, extend their understanding of the youth they lead and the adults they work with, and to go to new levels of personal growth and learning as Scouters. As Scouting has grown and evolved, so too has Wood Badge. Today, Wood Badge provides advanced training in leadership and teamwork for adult leaders in all Scouting programs including Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Varsity, and Venturing as well as District and Council volunteers and professionals.

Wood Badge is the ultimate personal, professional, and scouting growth training program offered by the Scouting movement. Wood Badge is not just about learning leadership skills, it is about knowing, utilizing, and teaching those skills that make great and effective leaders. As an example, you will learn about effective communication, managing conflict, and the principles of leading both the youth and the adults from your unit or district. Wood Badge training is offered by the National Boy Scouts of America and the lessons learned go far beyond any other training course available through the Scouting movement at the District level, Council level, and the National BSA Philmont Training Center.
