Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

- 1. What is Powder Horn? Powder Horn is a resource course designed to introduce youth and adult leaders to fun and challenging outdoor/high-adventure program possibilities for their unit. It complements the training-based Wood Badge and NYLT courses in delivering the promise of scouting adventure at the unit level.
- 2. When is Powder Horn? The course spans two weekends in September. The first weekend begins Friday evening Sept 6th and ends Sunday afternoon Sept 8th. The second weekend begins Friday morning Sept 20th and ends Sunday afternoon Sept 22nd.
- 3. Who can attend Powder Horn? Youth 14 or older (or Venturing crew member 13 y.o. and completed 8th grade) and all adults registered in the BSA. Youth must have completed leadership training for their unit type (Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops/Crews ILST, ILSC). Prior NYLT training is highly recommended to enable youth to bring the program back to the unit. Adult mentors are highly encouraged to attend Powder Horn as well.
