As a volunteer, I will serve as an example of character

- By following the Scout Law: A Scout is Trustworthy, Loyal, Helpful, Courteous, Kind, Obedient, Cheerful, Thrifty Brave, Clean and Reverent.
- By abstaining use or reference of any tobacco, drugs, or alcohol while at Scouting events.
- By modeling inclusion and kindness in any and all responsibilities given to me.

I will abide by BSA policies that are in place to protect our youth

- Keep youth participants in a buddy system.
- Stay in an adult buddy system while instructing/interacting with youth.
- Avoid one-on-one contact with youth, in-person, email or through text.
- Report any suspicion of abuse (it is the law), and notify the event lead of any violations of the above policies.

I will respond and report bullying of any kind by

- Recognize: Bullying is any unwanted aggressive behavior by an adult, youth, or a group that involves an observed or perceived power imbalance and is likely to be repeated multiple times.
- Prevent: Keep close supervision of your group. Bullies seek to isolate their victims.
- Respond: Break the cycle of bullying by intervening. Stop the behavior and try to resolve. Don't use labels. Use respect, fairness, and compassion when intervening.
- Report: If serious physical harm or mental health concerns are present, please report to local authorities and SCOUTS First Helpline 1(844) 726-8871. If not life-threating, make your team & team leader aware to monitor and possibly alert parent.
