

# What's the Jamboree Uniform?



#### Field Uniform (aka Class A)

Will wear for travel, DC visit and arena shows

- Field Uniform/Class A shirt with appropriate Jamboree and rank patches. No merit badge sashes please.
- Jamboree Contingent neckerchief
- Jamboree Contingent hat
- Scout belt (web or Scout-related leather)
- Scout shorts or Scout long pants
- Scout socks
- Comfortable, sturdy, lace up shoes (lace up athletic, hiking, etc.)

# What's the Jamboree Uniform?



#### **Activity Uniform (aka Class B)**

Will wear at Jamboree other than arena shows

- T-shirt (can be any Scout related T-shirt such as contingent shirt, home troop shirt, OA shirt, high adventure shirt) or a plain, single-colored T-shirt with no writing.
- Scout shorts or Scout long pants
- Comfortable, sturdy shoes
   (lace up athletic, hiking, etc.)

   No sandals/open toed shoes or Crocs!





#### **Personal Equipment Overview**

## All items must fit in duffle (Jamboree) and overnight bag (hotel)



- 1 duffle bag (provided) for all personal Jamboree items
   (115 liters, ~4 cu ft.)
- 1 overnight bag (provided) for DC and hotel portion of trip
- Day pack (school-style backpack is fine) for time out at camp each day
- Sleeping bag in stuff sack (30 degree rating)
- Two 1-liter bottles
- Dry wick towel
- Bandana
- Non-aerosol insect repellent
- 2 class A uniforms- i.e. 2 Scout shirts, 2 Scout pants (long or shorts), 2 pair Scout socks, 1 Scout belt, 1 Jamboree hat, 1 neckerchief. The complete Class A uniform will be worn while travelling and at arena shows.
- 1 pair long work pants (work pants required for Day of Service, may get paint on)

- 1 pair work gloves
- 1 pair broken-in hiking boots
- 1 pair lace-up shoes (lightweight sports) NO open-toed shoes or crocs
- 1 Rain gear (pants and jacket, lightweight)
- 1 jacket or sweatshirt (synthetic is good)
- 1 set of sleep clothes
- 5 pairs (at least) underwear
- 4-5 Scout/jamboree T-shirts/polo/activity shirts (microbial synthetic is good)
- 2-3 pairs of hiking socks
- 2-3 other pairs of socks
- 1 Travel Pillow
- 1 Swimsuit
- 1 pair Water Shoes
- 1 pair Sunglasses
- Sunscreen

# Patrol and Troop Equipment



- All Troop and Patrol gear is being provided by Jamboree
  - Includes tents, cots, cookware, gateways
- Cooking done by troops (not patrols)





# Personal Electronic Devices



- Smart phones are encouraged but not required. There will be a Jamboree App.
- PED's are the sole responsibility of the Scout/owner.
- Use of PEDs while traveling will be allowed provided they do not cause issues.
- Except for cell phones, digital cameras, radios or GPS systems, once at the Jamboree, all other items will be stowed.
- SM has the final say on all devices.
- Cell phones are for communications and as cameras – not games and internet.
- Cell phones may be used to contact home.
- We need cell phone numbers. Scouts are expected to answer calls from adult leaders.

 Unit leaders will not be responsible for arrangements to charge cell phones. Charging stations will be provided in each sub camp.

#### Consider an external battery with solar!

- Digital cameras and cell phones used as cameras should not be used to infringe on other people.
- Scouts are encouraged to listen to QBSA (Jamboree radio station).
- GPS units may be used during travel and at Jamboree when appropriate.
- All PEDs should be turned to silent and use earphone/buds for the entire trip.
- Confiscated PEDs will be returned to the Scout prior to entering the bus to leave Jamboree.
- Scouts are encouraged to recycle spent batteries.





### **Administrative Matters**



#### **Medical Forms**



- All participants should have received an email from National Jamboree to enter your personal health information.
  - <u>Filling this out is required!</u>
- In addition to the electronic form from National Jamboree, all participants will also need to complete Medical Forms A, B and C.
  - The physical for part C needs to have been completed within one year of the event (i.e. dated after July 29, 2022)
- Return the completed forms to your Jamboree Scoutmaster before the first shakedown in February.

#### **Swim Tests**




- All participants are required to provide a current copy of an official BSA swim test. The test must take place within 1 year of the event (i.e. performed after July 29, 2022).
- Tests will need to occur at the home unit (troop) level. For those that cannot complete it within your unit, please contact your Jamboree Scoutmaster.





#### **Identification for Flying**





- All scouts need a DPS-issued ID card.
  - Passports acceptable but NOT recommended
- Official DPS-issued ID will be required to attend second shakedown (March 25<sup>th</sup>)
- Takes at least 6-8 weeks for DPS to send card after applying, and appointment times may be several months out so please plan accordingly!



# World Strides Registration



- World Strides is the company handling all of our travel logistics
- (TENTATIVE) All Jamboree participants are required to register on- line with World Strides
  - Website and Trip ID for registration will be provided at a later date
  - You will also need your Jamboree Troop number which will be assigned at a later date.



#### **Online Application**



- Please keep your online application with National current
  - If your email is incorrect then:
    - No Medical Form
    - No other updates from National regarding the event
- Be sure and upload a photo to your profile
  - Photos are used for Jamboree issued badge

#### 2023 Patch Set



- Full set is 8 patches, including the large Texas patch
- Each scout will receive four of their unit patches plus one full set
  - Blue unit will have the Longhorn
  - Red Unit will have the Blue Bonnet
  - Green Unit will have the Armadillo
  - Staff will have the Bat
  - Committee will have the Lizard
- OA flap provided to everyone but may only be worn by OA members





#### **Patch Trading**



- Patch trading is an official Jamboree event with a designated area
  - Each evening on the upper deck/lawn of the Summit Stadium
- Great opportunity to trade patches with other Scouts
  - Adults can only trade with other adults
- All patches you bring have to fit in your duffel or overnight bag.



#### Memorabilia (aka "Swag") Orders



- All orders for memorabilia (aka "swag") including patches and apparel will be placed online through Blackpug (link not yet available).
- As part of your Jamboree fee, each Scout receives:
  - Troop neckerchief
  - Troop T-shirt (provide your shirt size on the online form!)
  - Troop hat
  - 4 unit patches for your specific troop
  - 1 Complete JSP (Jamboree Shoulder Patch) set
  - 2 Jamboree Troop Numbers
- March 1 is order deadline
