National Jamboree Recommended Gear, Clothes and Essentials List

What to Bring:

Everything you bring must fit in the Jamboree duffel bag and overnight bag and your personal day pack. It is important that participants pack the right items.

Personal Gear

- Sleeping bag (lightweight in stuff sack with 30 degree rating is good) + a flat sheet is a good idea
- 2 One-liter water bottles
- 1 Toiletry kit (keep it small)
- 1 Dry wick towel
- Bandanas
- SMALL Flashlight and extra batteries
- Sunscreen
- 1 non-aerosol insect repellent
- Pocket money for snacks, souvenirs, extra trading patches, etc.
- 2 30 Gallon trash bags to keep gear/clothing dry
- 10'x10' Lightweight plastic sheet, (Painter's drop cloth) to keep cot/bedding dry
- Smart Phone with wall charger and cable, Ziploc baggies to keep it dry
 - 3-way 3 prong power splitter for charger is a good idea (No power strips)
- 2 Pens and a small notepad
- Day Pack
- Personal medications and first aid kit
- 25 feet of lightweight cord
- 1 drinking cup

Clothing

- 2 Class A uniforms - 2 scout shirts, 2 scout pants (long or shorts), 2 pair scout socks, 1 scout belt, 1 Jamboree hat, 1 neckerchief.
 - The Class A uniform will be worn while travelling, in Washington DC and selected Jamboree events/shows.
 - If you only own one set, borrow the second set from a friend.
- 1 set long work pants, long sleeve shirt & gloves (For Day of Service-may get paint on)
- 1 pair broken-in hiking boots.
- 1 pair lace-up, closed toe shoes (lightweight sports) NO open-toed shoes or Crocks
 - Shower shoes can only be worn in but not to/from the showers.
- 1 Set of Rain gear (pants and jacket, li will rain) (Ponchos are not a good idea)
- 1 Jacket or sweatshirt (synthetic is highly recommended)
- 1 set of sleep clothes
- 5 pairs (at least) underwear
- 4-5 Scouting T-shirts/activity shirts. Must be Scouting oriented or plain color shirts.
- 4-5 pairs of hiking socks
- 1-2 pairs of sock liners
- 1 Travel Pillow
- 1 Swimsuit – If a BSA Swimmer
- 1 pair Water Shoes, closed toe, NO AQUA socks.
 - Old tennis shoes work great.
- 1 pair Sunglasses
- Laundry bag or extra Pillowcase
 - DO NOT PUT WET CLOTHES IN A PLASTIC BAG UNTIL JUST BEFOR LEAVING JAMBOREE
- OA Sash (Optional and if you are a member of the Lodge). Merit Badge Sashes are not recommended.

The National Jamboree will be providing the cots and cooking gear.

The Capitol Area Council Contingent will be providing Tents, plates and utensils.

What to carry on the Plane

1. Council-issued carry-on bag:

Each person will be issued a carry-on bag. You carry this carry-on as you board the plane. Personal Hygiene/toiletry kit:(toothbrush, toothpaste, comb, shaving gear, deodorant) TRAVEL SIZE LIQUIDS

- 1 set sleeping clothes
- 2 pair underwear
- 2 pair scout socks
- 1 pair scout shorts
- 1 scout T-shirt
- Optional: Camera, Cell phone, charger (2 port recommended), headphones (Please no Speaker calls or Music)
- Medications
- Empty water bottle
- Rain jacket

2. Personal day pack

This is your personal backpack. You will take this bag with you every day while in DC and every day as you explore the Jamboree.

3. Wear on person on plane (required):

- BSA Class “A” scout Jamboree Uniform: Scout Shirt (with Jamboree Council shoulder patch, Jamboree troop number patch, Jamboree patch above right pocket, rank patch, BSA world crest.), Jamboree Neckerchief, BSA Scout Shorts or BSA Scout Pants, Scout Belt, Scout T-shirt under Scout uniform shirt, Scout Socks, Sturdy Boots or shoes and Jamboree Cap.
- Wallet with Personal ID (DPS ID card)
- Watch or cell phone so you can tell time!

4. Important Notes:

- Participants will check-in one duffel each—max weight 50 pounds
- No need for pocket knives!

REMEMBER: YOU WILL NOT HAVE ACCESS TO YOUR LARGE DUFFEL UNTIL WE UNPACK AT THE SUMMIT. EVERYTHING THAT YOU NEED WHILE TOURING D.C. MUST BE IN YOUR CARRY-ON BAG OR DAYPACK.

What Not to Bring

- Anything you can't afford to lose. (Heirloom knives)
We will be going through Metal Detectors at the Airports
- Large knives/axes, nothing to use them on anyway.
- Large Flashlights, just add weight-Use a small flashlight instead.
- Refrain from too many Cotton clothes. They take a long time to dry. NON-Scout oriented clothing, including Band, Sports and School T-Shirts and hats.
 - Jamboree, Troop, BSA Summer Camp T-Shirts are fine.
 - Anything you can buy at the Scout shop or at Scout camp is fine.
 - Plain color shirts are fine.
- Slide on shoes, open toe shoes, toe glove shoes.
We do not want blisters or hurt toes.
- Non-Scouting belts

Contingent Policy

Personal Electronic Devices

1. Personal electronic devices (PEDs - digital cameras, mp3 players, personal game consoles, portable DVD players, cell phones, radios, GPS, etc.) will be allowed during the Jamboree subject to this policy. PED's are the sole responsibility of the Scout/owner - the contingent will not take time to look for lost items, go back to get forgotten items, deal with disagreements about usage, help find a place to charge the devices, or find batteries.
2. Use of PEDs while traveling will be allowed provided they do not cause issues - as determined by the Scoutmaster - potential issues include but are not limited to inappropriateness for a Scout activity such as extremely violent or sexual content, use in violation of airline or tour destinations (e.g. museum) policy, and distraction from the Jamboree experience.
3. Except for cell phones, digital cameras, radios or GPS systems which use is described further below, once at the Jamboree, all items will be stowed in the Scout/owner's duffel for the duration of time at Jamboree e.g. no gaming or movies during the evenings or other down time.
4. If at any time, the Scoutmaster, as final decision maker, determines that a PED is a distraction from the spirit of Jamboree, the PED will be confiscated and held for the remainder of the trip.
5. Cell phones may be used while touring and at the Jamboree for communications, as cameras and for accessing the Jambo app. They are not to be used for games, web surfing or other non-Jamboree related uses.
6. Cell phones may be used to contact home, provided that contact does not distract from the spirit of Jamboree or inconvenience others.
7. All cell phone numbers will be gathered and listed in the Unit Leaders' contacts lists so that the unit can communicate with Scouts while touring and at the Jamboree.
8. Unit leaders will not be responsible for arrangements to charge cell phones. While the Jamboree has taken steps to increase and improve charging stations, all participants should anticipate that at some point during the Jamboree the cell phone will lose its charge and there may not be a place to recharge. Cell phone charging will have priority over other PEDs
9. Scouts are expected to answer calls from adult leaders and to respond quickly to text messages from adult leaders.

10. Digital cameras and cell phones used as cameras should not be used to infringe on other peoples' privacy or in any other inappropriate manner. For example: no pictures in the shower, tents, toilet or while changing clothes. Pictures of any revealing, sexual or inappropriate manner will not be allowed or tolerated. Any scouts caught taking pictures of this type and/or of having such inappropriate pictures on their device(s) will have their devices confiscated and will be removed from the Jamboree site.
11. The Jamboree operates radio station QBSA at which Scouts have an opportunity to host as a DJ. Scouts are encouraged to listen to QBSA so long as it is not a distraction. Scouts should limit radios to something small. "Boom" boxes (large portable stereos) are prohibited. Scouts are encouraged to coordinate with their Jamboree Patrol Leader and limit the number of radios per patrol.
12. GPS units may be used during travel and at Jamboree when appropriate.
13. All PEDs should be turned to silent and use earphone/buds for the entire trip.
14. Confiscated PEDs will be returned to the Scout prior to entering the bus to leave Jamboree. They may be confiscated during the return trip if used improperly.
15. Scouts are encouraged to recycle spent batteries.
16. Devices should be kept in a waterproof container or bag.

How to update contact information

In consideration of being allowed to participate in Adventure WV, LLC and American Canadian Expeditions, LTD and River Expeditions, Inc. whitewater rafting and other whitewater activities (the "Activity"), I represent that I understand the nature of this Activity and that I am qualified, in good health, and in proper physical condition to participate in the Activity, which involves travel on or being in whitewater rivers and streams. I agree to only participate while wearing the protective and safety equipment required, to follow the instructions of the guides and, if I believe it unsafe, to immediately discontinue my participation. I know that the Activity involves substantial risk of serious bodily injury, including disability, paralysis and death, and damage or loss of personal property as the result of exposure; travel on or being in whitewater rivers and streams; and other known and foreseeable risks including, but not limited to, the risks of travel on roads or rough terrain by foot, conveyances, or other means; the risks arising from the failure or misuse of equipment; and the risks that injuries may occur in remote areas without adequate medical facilities. I realize that there may be other risks not known to me or not readily foreseeable but I fully accept and assume all such risks, whether or not identified above, and I assume all responsibility for losses and damages which I may suffer as a result of my participation in this Activity.

(West Virginia Code § 20-3B-1 through 5)

- (a) Participants have a duty to act as would a reasonably prudent person when engaging in recreational activities offered by commercial whitewater outfitters and commercial whitewater guides in this state.
- (b) No participant may:
- (1) Board upon or embark upon any commercial whitewater expedition when intoxicated or under the influence of non-intoxicating beer, intoxicating beverages or controlled substances; or
 - (2) Fail to advise the trip leader or the trip guide of any known health problems or medical disability and any prescribed medication that may be used in the treatment of such health problems during the course of the commercial whitewater expedition; or
 - (3) Engage in harmful conduct or willfully or negligently engage in any type of conduct which contributes to or causes injury to any person or personal property; or
 - (4) Perform any act which interferes with the safe running and operation of the expedition, including failure to use safety equipment provided by the commercial whitewater outfitter or failure to follow the instructions of the trip leader or trip guide in regard to the safety measures and conduct requested of the participants; or
 - (5) Fail to inform or notify the trip guide or trip leader of any incident or accident involving personal injury or illness experienced during the course of any commercial whitewater expedition. If such injury or illness occurs, the participant shall leave personal identification, including name and address, with commercial whitewater outfitter's agent or employee.

Student Code of Conduct

The WorldStrides experience you have elected to attend offers many unique opportunities and experiences. WorldStrides believes that learning best takes place in a safe environment. Beyond the educational benefits, the program offers opportunities to form new friendships and to meet the challenges of independence. All students are expected to demonstrate high standards of conduct, exhibit responsible judgement, and treat others with dignity and respect. As a student participant, it is your responsibility to be engaged and help make the program a positive and enjoyable experience for all.

Additionally, while participating on the program, the student is responsible for adhering to the following rules of behavior:

1. Students are expected to follow all directions given by and all rules and regulations established by the Program Leader and Chaperones.
2. Students are expected to follow all COVID-19 specific rules established by WorldStrides and the Program Leader and Chaperones, and any rules established by attractions, sites, and service providers.
3. Students are expected to remain with the group at all times, unless the Program Leader specifically allows free time in small groups. The student may never leave the hotel unless accompanied by a Program Leader or Chaperone.
4. Physical, verbal, or virtual violence, bullying, cyberbullying, inappropriate language, or inappropriate interactions with others will not be tolerated. Harassment based on real or perceived race, color, religion, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, or other protected characteristic is prohibited.
5. Emailing, posting, texting, airdropping, or otherwise electronically sharing pornographic, derogatory, or offensive language or images with other participants, staff, or members of the WorldStrides community is strictly prohibited. Electronically sending offensive language or images based on race, color, religion, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, or other protected characteristic or political affiliation by any means is strictly prohibited.
6. Students should refrain from taking photographs, creating video or audio recordings of other students, staff members, or other individuals without their consent.
7. Students are expected to refrain from smoking, vaping of any kind, illegal drug use, vandalism, theft, gambling, or any other type of behavior that is judged by the Program Leader and/or Chaperones to be detrimental to the health, well-being, safety, or reputation of oneself or others.
8. Students are not permitted to consume alcohol unless they are of legal age and have approval from their parent/guardian and Program Leader.
9. Students are expected to comply with all rules and regulations established by governmental agencies and service providers including but not limited to airlines, hotels, motorcoach companies, national parks, and national security.
10. Students should leave all services (hotels, restaurants, motorcoaches) utilized and sites visited during the programming in the same condition in which they were found. Any property damage, theft, vandalism, unauthorized use, and copyright violations are the sole responsibility of the student and parent/guardian. If an incident occurs, the student and parent/guardian will be required to work directly with the provider to remedy the situation.
